Some Thoughts on Roe vs. Wade

Thirty-eight years ago Roe vs. Wade was passed taking abortion from a crime to a constitutional right. All these years later it's a good time to reflect on what we were promised by abortion rights advocates and what we have actually gained.

• We were promised that it would protect children from being unwanted and abused. Instead, child abuse and child poverty is soaring, primarily because of the breakdown of the family unit. • We were promised that it was progress for women. Women had no meaningful rights if they did not have the right to terminate their pregnancy. Thirty-eight years later abortions are disproportionately acts of the poorest and most vulnerable women among us. This is progress?

• Promiscuity has continued to rise. Most women are settling for a meaningless act with uncommitted partners in the name of sexual freedom, thinking in the back of their mind that if they get pregnant they can always have an abortion. This is progress?

• Americans who support abortion do so reluctantly because they think that it is a necessary evil. In the long run, reversing the abortion culture begun by Roe vs. Wade will require persuading Americans that pitting mothers against their unborn child is not a good way to help either.
